

# MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE SANGER CITY COUNCIL

February 19, 2015 6:00 P.M. Council Chamber

A regular meeting of the Sanger City Council was held on Thursday, February 19, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber.

The regular meeting was called to order at 6:01 p.m.

### A. <u>OPENING CEREMONIES</u>

1. <u>SUBJECT:</u> APPROVED - Award of Contract for Construction of Groundwater Monitoring Wells at Lincoln Ponds Wastewater Disposal Site.

The City Council by motion of Mayor Mitchell: 1) awarded the contract for the Construction of Monitoring Wells at Lincoln Ponds Wastewater Disposal Site to Consolidated Testing Laboratories, Inc., Exeter, CA 93221, in the amount of \$68,330.00; 2) approved a construction contingency for change orders in the amount of \$6,833.00 (10%); 3) authorized the City Manager to execute the agreement; and 4) adopted Resolution No. 4533 approving a 2014-2015 Fiscal Year Budget Amendment to the Capital Improvement Budget to include Groundwater Monitoring Wells. ### 4. SUBJECT: APPROVED - Formation of Dispatch Ad Hoc Committee

#### H. CITY MANAGER/STAFF COMMUNICATION

Community & Economic Development Manager Dan Spears reported on his attendance at the Food Processing Expo in Sacramento.

City Manager Haddix reported the following: the next Town Hall meeting will be a park summit; the Skate Park dedication is scheduled for March 3, 2015 and will include an introduction of the new Adopt-A-Park program; surveillance cameras have been very effective; have had great success in working with the National Park Transit Agency; CAL-Home program is very popular; the Solar Ray dedication will be scheduled soon.

## I. MATTERS INITIATED BY CITY COUNCILMEMBERS

Council Member Ontiveros had nothing to report.

Council Member Pacheco thanked the Council for rejecting Item G-2.

Mayor Pro Tem Cantu reported the following: the landscaping was installed at the Skate Park by a local landscaper and it looks great; had the honor of volunteering at the WAMS Career Day and thanked Chief Rodriguez, Chief Tarascou and City Manager Haddix for also participating.

Mayor Mitchell reported the following: echoed Council Member Pacheco's comment regarding Item G-2 and indicated that had it been approved it would have been a wrong turn for the community; loves Sanger with all his heart and works very hard for the community that has seen a lot of progress; the 7<sup>th</sup> largest manufacturer, Initiative Foods is in Sanger; Cargill is current undergoing an expansion; will be picking up the permit from the owner and developer of Sonic in Wasco next week; ADA complications have delayed the opening of State Foods Supermarket; will meet with a developer next week interested in building a strip mall in Sanger.
